To Rush Kent Electric Line.

The Kent Traction Company has made known their plans to run an electric railway line between Chestertown and Talbotton to carry freight from points on the Eastern Shore to Talbotton and then have it shipped to Baltimore.

Mr. Lamkin, secretary and Treasurer, said the undertaking would likely mean a partial solution of the problem now engaging the thought of so many Baltimore merchants in regard to lost Eastern Shore trade. The railway will either touch or pass near the towns of Parke, George Town, Sandy Bottom, Rock Hall, Menard and Tanfield, and will provide good service, they say, at low freight rates.

Steamers will carry the freight to Baltimore at small cost. The financial end of the matter has been arranged with a comfortable margin left over, Mr. Lamkin said, and the work of completing the road will now be rushed. The rights of way have been secured.
