KNOX IN THE LEAD

Friends Actively Engaged in Laying His Claims Before The People.

Washington, Jan. 10.—(Special) The Republican National Convention, when it meets in Chicago on June 16, will contain 900 delegates. This number was fixed when the Republican National Committee met here in Washington on December 6, and allotted two delegates to each of the territories. Each state has two delegates for every senator and representative in Congress.

It will take 491 votes, a majority, to nominate. None of the candidates mentioned has anything approximating the number of votes necessary. No delegates have been elected or even pledged by the action of party convention to Secretary William H. Taft, except six from Alaska, and this number has been cut down to two by action of the national committee. Grave doubts are entertained as to whether Taft will get a majority of the delegates from Ohio, his own state. The 54 votes of Illinois are committed to Joseph G. Cannon, and, in addition, two delegates have been elected and instructed for him in the eighth Michigan district. However, under the call of the national committee, these two delegates must be elected over again. Vice President Charles W. Fairbanks will get 30 votes of Indiana, and Senator La Follette is expected to have Wisconsin's 26 votes. Gov. Hughes of New York is far from assured of the 78 votes of that state.

Senator Philander C. Knox, of Pennsylvania, has the 68 votes of that state pledged to him by the unanimous action of the Republican State Convention. He has more real, visible strength than any other candidate. His record in the Roosevelt cabinet and in the Senate has made him strong in all parts of the country, so that there are several other state delegations that consistently can be placed to his credit. The vast majority of states are fighting territory for all the candidates. Senator Knox's friends are actively engaged in laying his claims before the voters and they expect him to go into the convention with a formidable number of delegates supporting him. From the first the Knox people have refrained from any sort of pyrotechnical politics and the steady growth of its strength is leaving more substantial impression than that of any other candidate.

A plan for drawing trade to a town that has been successfully worked at several points might be adopted to advantage in Centreville. The plan is as follows: An agreement was reached between all the merchants whereby they offered special sales on certain days, each merchant selecting some special line of goods upon which he made a lower price than usual. Thus one dry goods house would sell gloves at a special price, while another would offer bargains in dress goods. One hardware merchant would reduce the price on skates. Every line of business was represented and care was taken that no conflicts occurred. Prizes were then offered to the farmers bringing the best load of grain or the handsomest baby and the bargain day was extensively advertised in the surrounding country, the name of the merchants and their special sales being in all cases stated. The farmers responded in a most gratifying manner and the merchants were well pleased with the plan. The idea has already been carried out in several cities.

BUSINESS WAS BETTER

Not As Many Failures On The Peninsula During 1907.

The business record of the Delaware, Maryland and Virginia Peninsulas for the year 1907, according to figures furnished by E. G. Dunn & Co., shows a decrease of five failures as compared with 1906 and a decrease of \$1 from 1905, a decrease in liabilities in 1906 of \$243,927.90. The assets of 1906 exceed those of 1907 by \$256,332.49.

The district covered by the figures comprises 14 counties, New Castle, Kent, and Sussex of Delaware; Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's, Talbot, Caroline, Dorchester, Wicomico, Somerset and Worcester, Maryland; and Northampton and Accomac, Virginia.

Following are the figures of the failures in 1907: Number of failures in Delaware 38 with \$643,399.20 liabilities, and \$217,259.88 assets; Maryland, 28 failures, with \$102,099.04 liabilities, and \$46,800.05 assets; Virginia, 6 failures, with \$24,234.92 liabilities, and \$17,163.15 assets.

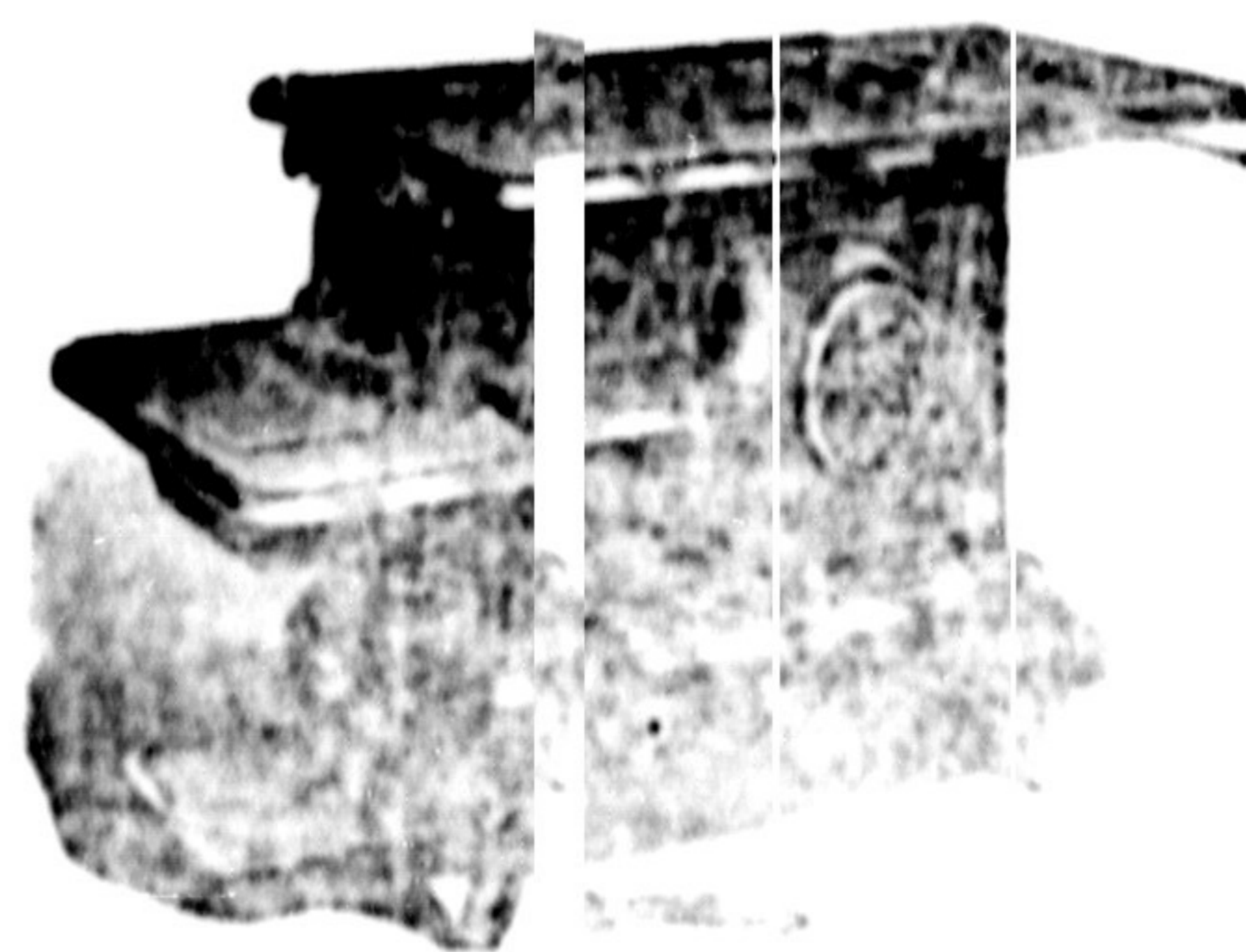

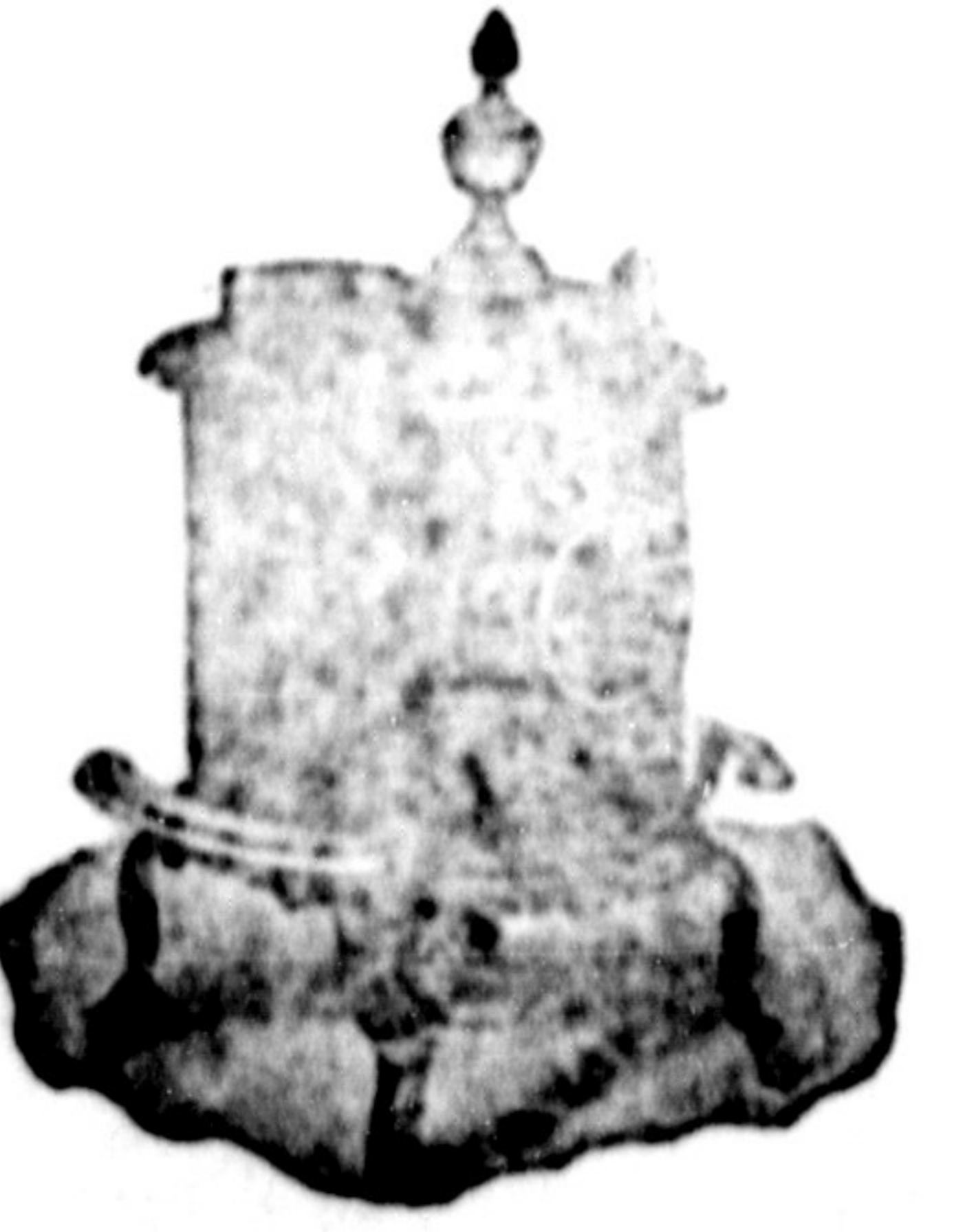
