MR. CLEVELAND'S LETTER.

For the third time Grover Cleveland has written a letter accepting the proffer of his party to take hold of the helm of the ship of state that he might once more attempt to direct the destinies of a people to what all good Democrats believe would prove the haven of safety.

Opposed to this theory the dogma is now boldly presented, that tariff taxation is justifiable for the express purpose and intent of thereby promoting special interests and enterprises.

Such a proposition is so clearly contrary to the spirit of our Constitution and so directly encourages the disturbance by selfishness and greed of patriotic sentiment that its entire rejection is a duty which our people if they had not already been insidiously allured from the safe landmarks of principle.

These pretenses should no longer deceive.

The truth is that our tariff system is directly antagonized by every sentiment of justice and fairness of which Americans are prominently proud. It is also true that the interests of our farmers and farmers can, the least of all our people, defend themselves against a harder home life which such tariff taxation decrees, the workingman, suffering from the importation and employment of pauper labor instigated by his professional friends, and seeking security for his interests in organized co-operation, are equally helpless.

Through the question of tariff legislation also involves a question of morals.

We cannot with impunity permit injustice to rob the spirit of right and equity from the life of our nation, for we shall fail to reach our national destiny if greed and selfishness lead the way.

Though we oppose the theory that tariff laws may be passed having for their object the granting of discriminating and unfair governmental aid to private ventures, we wage no exterminating war against any American industry.

The people are entitled to sound and honest money, abundantly sufficient in volume to supply their business needs. But whatever may be the form of the people's currency, national or State, whether gold, silver or paper, it should be so regulated and guarded by governmental action, or by wise and careful laws, that no one can be deluded as to the certainty and stability of its value.

Public officials are the agents of the people.

It is therefore, their duty to secure for their people the best and most efficient means of doing public work. This plainly can be best accomplished by regarding ascertained fitness in the selection of government employees. These considerations cannot be sufficient justification for an honest adherence to the letter and spirit of civil service reform.

Our pension roll should be a roll of honor, unblemished by ill desert and unvisited by demagogic use.

A generous hospitality, which is one of the most prominent of our national characteristics, prompts us to welcome

the worthy and industrious of all lands to homes and citizenship among us. This hospitable sentiment is not velleit, however, by careless and reasonable regulations for the protection of the public health, nor does it justify the reception of immigrants who have no appreciation of our institutions and whose presence among us is a menace to peace and good order.

In an imperfect and incomplete manner I have thus endeavored to state some of the things which accord with the creed and intentions of the party to which I have given my life-long allegiance. My attempt has not been to instruct my countrymen, but to present to them the Democratic doctrine in the principles of our government and to promote the people's good. I am willing to be accused of addressing my countrymen upon trite topics and in a homely fashion, for I believe that important truths are found on the surface of thought, and that they should be stated in direct and simple terms. Though much is left un-written, my record as a public servant leaves no excuse for misunderstanding my belief and position on the questions which are presented to the voters of the land for their decision.

The "silent forces" of the country are all in favor of Cleveland.

As will be seen by our advertising columns, a Democratic meeting is announced for Monday evening next, to be held in the Court House, Ellicott City. Let there be a full turnout.

Senator A. P. Gorman was at the Democratic headquarters in New York on Tuesday and expects to remain actively at work there until election day, provided his health permits.

We are in receipt of the initial numbers of The Sentinel, a new venture in the newspaper line, at Elktion, Md., Mr. G. W. Crisshank, editor. Mr. Cleveland's letter of acceptance is sufficient to say that he has outlined in a general way what the people may expect of him if he is made president. In short he is in favor of a sound currency, tariff reform on broad and equitable principles, just pensioning of the soldiers without demagogic paternalism, opposed to indiscriminate immigration, the force bill, the reckless waste of the nation's resources and the dangerous tendency to centralism which has crept into Republican policy of late years.

The letter breathes a spirit of unselfish patriotism and is worthy the exigencies of the times. Following are some of the salient points:

"The protection of the people in the exclusive use and enjoyment of their property and earnings, concededly constitutes the special purpose and mission of our free government."

"Tariff legislation presents a familiar form of federal taxation. Such legislation results as surely in a tax upon the daily life of our people as the tribute paid directly into the hands of the tax-collector.
