PROVISIONS FOR WOMEN IN A NEW HOTEL.

The Hotel that had received Fifth Avenue, New York, by one of the Astors is built on an original plan. Its provision for ladies is described:

The whole Fifth Avenue front on the ground floor is occupied by the large dining room nearly 100 feet long. We are told that this restaurant is to be a special feature of the hotel, and that New York is to have here what it has not and Paris has not, a public restaurant with proper facilities for ladies who wish to rest, to await friends, to entertain friends and domestic, and in every respect a place of resort for a lady on West Thirty-third street leads to a suitably spacious vestibule, on the left of which is the "Marie Antoinette" reception room, while to the right you turn into the large dining room. This vestibule leads to the main corridor of the building, which lies east and west. Between this and the street are the ladies' reception room above; then, going west, the smoking room or "Turkish salon" (decorated in the tasteful and elegant colors); then the main entrance to the West Thirty-third street and a reception room for arriving guests, the the ballroom, beyond which is a driveway to the offices in the basement.

This we regard for a whole avenue front and the whole street front. The remainder of the ground floor is occupied by the cafe, the garden court, which is a square space in the middle of the building, and a rich design in white terra cotta, and roofed with a revolving dome for free air in summer, the main staircase, the reading room, the service rooms for the great dining room, and other such necessities. A change in American hotel life is evident in the restricted space about the office and connected hall and passages, and in short the absence of that unmanly and unappreciated wasteful space which our older hotels leave free to the consumption of guest and guest's property. All that you get here is what you need, and guests are supposed to invite their friends into smoking room or cafe or restaurant or into a private room.

Another similar change is seen in the absence of large parlors for ladies on the story above. There are no public parlors there at all. Ladies in this hotel have only the reception hall for the evening with an upstair to meet their friends. Here is an upsetting of the old customs with a vengeance.

The old fashioned sitting in the parlor, the frequent turning into the drawing room of an evening are done away with or to be done away with.
