HANDY HELPS FOR HOUSEWIVES.
What Those With Domestic Cares on Them
Will Do in Certain Cases.
The model housewife will renovate
rattan chairs that have become discolored
by giving them a coat of white, black
or golden brown paint, and finishing with
a handsome cushion, says the "Philadel-
phia Record."
She will realize that plaster casts
which are properly waxed may be wiped
off with a damp cloth, and will last for
years without being injured, while an un-
waxed one soon becomes soiled, and it is
practically impossible to clean it.
She will screw an ordinary three-fold
towel rack to the wall near the kitchen
range, and will find it useful not only
for drying towels, but to serve as a sup-
port for jelly or pudding bags. She will
draw loops to the corners and hang
them on the rack, which may be spread
apart, holding the bag open while the
fruit or the pudding is poured in.
She will prevent brick pavements from
becoming green and slimy in damp places
and shady spots by first scrubbing them
clean and then mixing a pound of sal-
tred in a bucket of water and scrub-
bing them over with this. It will make
them bright and clean, and by filling the
cracks between the bricks with the sal-
tred and moss from growing there.
She will make a tough beefsteak ten-
der by pouring two tablespoonsful each
of good olive oil and vinegar on a large
plate and laying the steak in this mix-
ture for several hours, until ready to
broil over a very hot fire, or fry it in a
hot pan without any fat. The oil,
which has kept it moist while the vinegar
was making tender the tough fibers,
will not taste after it is cooked.
She will remember that it is a mistaken
idea to cover a carpet with a rug in the
belief that it will save it, as the grind-
ing on the floor is what wears out the
carpet, and the protection should come
from beneath.
She will rub a few drops of sweet oil
or lard on the surface of a mustard plas-
ter, to prevent it from blistering the skin
while drawing.
She will remember that there is nothing
better for sore throat than a gargle
of salt and water; that it may be used as
often as desired, and that the swallow-
ed water each time it is used it will cleanse
the throat and allay the irritation.
She will find that pans and kettles will
last much longer if they are scrubbed
before the fire a few minutes after clean-
ing, to get thoroughly dry inside; for she
will realize if they are put away in a
damp condition they will soon become
rusty, and in a short time quite unfit for
use.
She will save all scraps of bread,
spread them on a plate in a moderate
oven until perfectly dry, then crush and
roll with a rolling pin, sift and put in a
jar ready for the many uses to which
they may be put. What does not go
through the sieve she will use for bread,
or in a separate jar for bread puddings,
&c.
LARGE AND HEALTHY.
The Present Woman Compared With Her
Ancestress.
Doctor Amanda Taylor Norris gave
another of her lectures to a large and at-
tentive audience, composed of the lead-
ing married women of Baltimore, at the
parish house of Emanuel Church, on the
30th ult. The doctor commenced by say-
ing that women cared more about phys-
ical culture now than at any time pre-
vious. In general, she wants to enjoy
robust health, and wants to exercise her
brain as well as her body. She wishes to
relish being termed the weaker sex, so
she vies with the sterner sex in looking
carefully after her health to prevent dis-
ease. A great improvement is also shown
in the care and training of young children,
and parents do not send them to school
until a few years have passed over their
heads. Play with children, which used
to be restricted, is now allowed free vent,
and the result is that their muscular and
nervous systems are strengthened, and
their growth and development increased.
This system is showing itself in a strong
generation of men and women. The
proportion of girls who pass through the
colleges now are taller, stronger, and
more developed than girls of the same
years ago. A proof of this is that women
are better developed physically than
formerly, is the fact that the old dresses
among the Colonial relics are much too
small for the ladies who now wear them.
The doctor congratulated herself that
it was the fashion to be considered deli-
cate and weak. People must abstain
from the bondage of tight and heavy
clothing, or they will make little pro-
gress. The reason of this is that many
women can take little exercise on ac-
