The Mayor Signs the Ordinance Granting the Franchise. Mayor Latrobe, of Baltimore, has approved the ordinance permitting the Edmondson Avenue, Catonsville and Ellicott City Electric Railway Company, which is the Maryland division of the proposed Washington Baltimore Boulevard Electric Line, to lay tracks on Saratoga street.

The ordinance also authorizes the company to use the 4 feet 8 inches gauge instead of the 5 feet and 4 inches gauge, which is used by other street railway lines in Baltimore.

There are now about 200 men at work on the Edmondson Avenue track and this force will be increased within the next few days. The contractors have been given orders to push the work with all possible haste as the company is anxious to have the line in operation within the time prescribed by the charter granted by the last Congress, which was 18 months.

The work of construction has been considerably advanced to the hanging of the ordinance in the Committee on Street Railways of the City Council for several weeks. It is believed that the failure of the matter was due to the opposition of certain interests identified with street-car lines in this city, with which the new organization was in active competition. The principal objection was the gauge.

The company asked for permission to use the same gauge as that used by the Washington and Annapolis line, which is 5 feet 4 inches. The standard gauge in all the principal cities of the United States, except Baltimore. The gauge in use here is 5 feet 6 inches. The Edmondson and Ellicott City line have been forced to adopt that gauge if they have necessitated a change of cars between this city.

The gentlemen who are promoting the new enterprise express the opinion that the delay in passing the bill by the Council will not change the plans of the company to have the entire line completed by the end of the summer. It is expected that the road will be worked by the end of the year.

The Washington and Baltimore Boulevard Electric road will be a part of the National Capital as possible. It will traverse one of the richest and most thickly populated sections of this State, and the gentlemen interested in the enterprise believe that the road will pay handsomely from the start.

The stock is principally owned in Baltimore, Washington and Annapolis. Mr. David Newcomb of Baltimore is president of the company.
