A'Mr Chamberlain, of Peachem, undertook the dangerous task of apprehending Miles For this purpose he went with a small party, and secured some ten or a dosen horses at a distance from the house, which had been stolen from the states. Here he left the party in a dark night, and proceeded to the house with another dog, able to withstand the former. He arrived at the door before the dog had notice, whe then immediately made at him. The other dog tackled in, and Chamberlain burst in the outside deer, proceeded to the door of the apartment in which he supposed Miles to be in hed; which being fastened, he burst in, and seized a person by the collar of his shirt, led him out of doors. and over the line into Vermont, about half a mile distant without any assistance. The person proved to be the culprit for whom he sought.
