WINTER ARRANGEMENT. GREAT SOUTHERN UNITED STATES MAIL LINE.

TRAVELERS FOR THE SOUTH, are informed that, by taking the Cars at Baltimore for Washington at 4 P. M., they proceed, via Washington, Frederickburg, Richmond, Petersburg, Weldon, and Wilmington, N. C. to CHARLESTON, S. C., reaching Charleston the second morning after leaving Baltimore, and one day in advance of the Bay Line - the Company on the route being bound by the Postmaster General to make the following quick schedule:

As this Line carries the Great Mail, (which cannot be delayed), and is almost entirely a Railroad Line, it will be perceived at once, that the Traveler, subject in some extent, while it is evident that Post's Boxes, Warrants, and Bonds, must often occasion delay in a Route, more than two-thirds of which is by the Bay - the traveler being also subjected to Sea-sickness, and incurring unnecessary risk, from Boston being urged to the top of their speed, to compete with the more DIRECT ISLAND ROUTE.

Mr. Dorsey reported a bill supplementary to an act to incorporate a Company to make a Turnpike Road from the District of Columbia to the city of Baltimore, passed Dec. 8, 1812. Read, passed and sent to the Senate. Mr. Graves reported a bill to alter and amend the Constitution so far as relates to the loaning of the public money on credit to corporations.

Mr. Gaither reported a bill to incorporate the Marine Total Abstinence Society of Baltimore. The bill to incorporate the Blacksmiths, Engineers, Mechanists, and Millwrights' Society of Baltimore, was passed. The bill to incorporate the Baltimore Hebrew and English Benevolent Academic Association was passed.

WHALE SHIPS LOST.

Capt. Brown, which arrived at New London on the 16th inst., with a full cargo of oil, received the information of the loss of the whale ship Samuel Wright, Coffin, of Salem; Hudson, of Sag Harbor; and Martha, Geography, Bay, near S. W. Cape of New Holland, in July or August last, from the Governor of St. George's Sound, who received the intelligence by an overland mail.

GOOD DIVIDEND.

The company who commenced were unable to finish it, and it passed to a new company for about one half its cost. The new company finished it, and placed in it furniture to the amount of \$25,000 dollars. During the nine months it has been in operation, the present proprietors have realized 10 per cent. on the cost. It will probably pay 20 or 25 per cent. per annum hereafter.

DEATH OF JAMES G. BROOKS.

The Albany Evening Journal states that James G. Brooks, Esq. extensively known in early life as a poet, and for the last fifteen years as the editor of different newspapers, died in that city, on Saturday morning last, after a long illness.


FROM METAMORAS.

News from Metamoras via New Orleans to the 27th ult., has been received. Nothing important. The Comanche Indians near Saultillo had stolen 10,000 mules and horses and much other property. Gen. Arista was taking measures for the general defence, and calling on every town and village for their proportion of troops. 2000 volunteers had assembled. President Bustamante's message was read the 1st January. It is of the common stamp. It was proposed to make Tampico a free port. The Vera Cruz merchants oppose it.

WRECK AND LOSS OF LIFE.

A letter from Orococo, N. C., published in the Journal of Commerce, states that the schr. Bounty, of New York, Totten, master, was lost in a snow storm on the 14th. Notwithstanding almost superhuman exertions were made to save them, three of the crew perished. The master, Mr. Totten, the mate, and two of the crew are saved, badly frostbitten. They were two days and two nights on the wreck, and came ashore on a part of the quarter deck.

CATHOLIC BISHOPS. Papal Bulls have been received from Rome, appointing the Rev. Richard Whelan, Bishop of Richmond, Va., and the Rev. John J. Canache, President of St. Mary's College, Baltimore, first Bishop of the new See of Natchez.
