WASHINGTON.

Washington, Nov. 30.—The records of the court martial are officially promulgated. These include two lieutenant colonels, three majors, fifteen captains, eighteen first lieutenants, and eight second lieutenants. They had committed various offenses, such as making false returns, disobedience of orders, and receiving money, misbehavior before the enemy, gambling and drinking with enlisted men, etc. Fifteen were convicted of drunkenness. Nearly all of these officers were dismissed from the service. A West Virginia man, for sending a challenge to fight a duel, was sentenced to be flogged. The sentence was mitigated to imprisonment. Boards for the examination of officers of the Commissary, Quartermaster and Pay Departments, have been established in different parts of the country, to examine all the military divisions.
