Washington Items.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3.—The commission of Vice Admiral Farragut was forwarded last evening in time to reach him on Sunday, as a new year's present.

The Bank of Commerce, of Georgetown, District of Columbia, owned by Messrs. Rittenhouse, Fowler & Co., has organized under the national currency act by the name of the National Bank of Commerce.

A suspension of purchases of horses is also directed at the following named places, and such suspension is to be continued until the 1st of March, when it will be withdrawn.

The Secretary of State left Washington to-night. He will attend the funeral of Hon. George M. Dallas, late Minister to England, which is to take place at Philadelphia, Wednesday, and Thursday.

The Secretary is attended by William Hunter, Esq., Chief Clerk of the State Department, Mr. Nicolay, the President's private secretary, and Mr. Herbert Lincoln, son of the President of the United States.

A paragraph has been copied in many newspapers, within three days past, that the Brazilian Representative near this government, has accepted Secretary Seward's letter in relation to the seizure of the Florida steamer.

The letter of the Secretary has, however, been transmitted to the Government of Brazil, and in due time an answer will be forwarded through the proper channels, which it is not doubted will be a response of friendly character.

The British Charge d'Affaires accompanied other foreign representatives to pay respect to the President yesterday, and afterwards called upon the Secretary of State at his residence.

A special messenger left Fort Monroe at the close of last week with dispatches from the Government for Admiral Porter.

Spain commenced falling here early this afternoon, and by night was sufficiently deep for sleighing, the first commencement of the kind this season.

The Committee on the Conduct of the War have returned from their trip North. They went to make an examination respecting iron clad vessels.

Later from Europe. New York, Jan. 3.—The steamer Etna, from Queenstown, on the 23d, has arrived. The steamer Edinburgh and Bremen have arrived out.

A Madrid despatch of the 21st states that the Spanish Ministry had submitted to the Queen a draft of a speech from the throne, on the opening of the Cortes, proposing the abandonment of St. Domingo.

London, Dec. 22.—The cotton market is firm, and prices are advancing. Provisions are quiet and prices steady. Breadstuffs are dull. Petroleum and tallow are quiet.
