The George's Hotel the International Hotel soon shared the same fate of the Commercial, and also a smaller public house, known as Wass' [inn. The station house of the Buffalo freight store-houses, containing large quantities of freight, were next burned, and in their onward course the flames quickly laid in ruins the passenger station of the Great Western Rallway Company, and also the treight houses, wood sheds and car shops, and the telegraph

The most appalling incident of the contagration was the burning to death of three young women, servants in the Commercial House. Two of them were smothered while sleeping, and the third was awakened and attempted to escape. A freman caught hold of her to drag her from the burning ruins, but her flesh had become so charred that it gave way, and in order to save his own life he had to leave her literally to rougt to death. daylight the remnants of the lifeless bodies were recovered and given to their friends.
