High Sheriff.* Partly cultivated by means whereof the same could not be effected by a common Warrant he therefore required a special Warrant to effect and secure it And that on return of a certificate of survey thereof he complying with all requisites agreeable to Act of Assembly may obtain a grant thereon having paid the sum of six Pounds two Shillings and six Pence Current Money Caution

for the same as appears *Vc.*

Lay out therefore and carefully survey for and in the name of him the said Alexander Catlett the aforesaid quantity of thirty five acres of Vacant Land be the same cultivated or otherwise not running your Lines within the lines of any former or more ancient survey nor manner or lands reserved by Act of Assembly and return your Certificate of survey thereof with the name of the Land and the exact Quantity therein contained with the Improvements thereon (if any) and the Value of such Improvements on Oath into the Land Office within one year from the date hereof there to be Transmitted to the Examiner General for due Examination and for your so doing this shall be your sufficient warrant and authority
