

HELMICK GROCERY STORE

The Helmick Grocery Store is believed to have been built circa 1855 for James and Jemima Wilson, heirs of the original settler in Flintstone, Elijah Robosson. The store consists of a two story, two bay wide frame structure with a gable roof. Eli and James Ash operated the store during the years of ownership of the Wilsons, and during the Civil War era, the store was raided and looted by Confederate troops. The Ash family finally purchased the store in 1876 and continued the business. The store is still in operation and remains a document to a way of life once found in Alleghany County in the mid 19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Helmick's Grocery Store lies on the south east corner of the intersection of Murley's Branch Road and Old Route 40 in Flintstone, Maryland.

The store is a basic two story , two bay wide frame structure covered with novelty siding. It is rectangular in shape and rests upon a low stone foundation. A rear addition of the same description but of lesser width as above abuts the south side of the block. The addition is covered with plain weatherboarding. Windows have plain trim and are mostly double hung wooden sash frames with two over two lights. There is, however, a six over six window on the first story of the south side of the store. Entrances on the north and south ends both have replaced hardware. The north (front) entrance used to have a transom light, but now has an electric fan in the opening. The soffit under the eaves used to contain brackets spaced at two foot intervals, but they have been since removed. Roofs over both blocks are simply gabled and are covered with replaced tin sheeting. There are no covered porches on the structure. Circular ventilators decorate the gables of the main block. One original corbeled brick chimney has a central location on the main block.

Helmick's Grocery Store retains most of its original fabric and appears much as it did when built in the 1800's. It currently stands structurally sound and is in fair to good condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Helmick Grocery Store is believed to have been built circa 1855 for James and Jemima Wilson, heirs of the original settler in Flintstone, Elijah Robosson. Jemima Robosson Wilson inheirited the property from her father Francis Robosson and construction of the store was begun. During the time of ownership of the Wilson family, Eli and son James Ash operated the store room. During the Civil War, Confederate troops raided and looted the store, taking what they needed and strewning the remainder in the street. In 1876, the Ash family finally bought the store from the Wilsons and later sold to John Robinette.

The store is still in operation as one of the oldest stores in the county, and is in very near original appearance. It remains a cultural and architectural reminder of a way of life once found in small communities in Allegany County.


