

BROWNING FRAME FARM HOUSE

Old Williams Road, Flintstone

ca. 1845

The Browning Farm House is a large, "L" shaped frame building with a gabled roof, six-over-six lights and brick end chimneys. The farm is particularly noteworthy because of its well preserved collection of dependencies. These include not only barns and tool sheds, but a small building which was used as a slave quarters. The farm was probably constructed by a member of the Twigg family and was known as the "Francis Twigg Farm" as late as 1909.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Browning Frame Farm House is located on the Old Williams Road near Rush in Allegany County.

The Browning Farm House is a large, two story, three bay wide rectangular frame building that has since been covered with asbestos siding. A two story addition abuts the main block on its northern side. The entire structure rests on a high stone foundation. The roof is gabled with a soffit and is covered with tin. Windows in the structure with the exception of those at the end of the rear wing are double hung, pegged, wooden sash frames with six over six lights. Windows on the main facade are flanked by louvered shutters. The main entrance is located on the south facade and features a vertically paneled door with a transom and side lights. Two original corbeled brick chimneys are located at the interior ends of the main block while a third is located in the interior of the rear wing. A one bay entrance porch with a hipped roof is located on the main facade. In addition a two story shed roofed, wrap around porch is located at the apex of the main block and the rear addition.

Located to the east of the main house is a small, frame, one story, two bay wide building that was probably used as a wash house. Also located on the farm are various other buildings including a smoke house and a large barn. Both are of frame construction and rest on stone foundations.

The Browning Farm is in fair condition and retains much of its original fabric and appearance.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Browning Farmhouse was constructed during the first half of the nineteenth century and is one of a large group of farmhouses, barns, etc. located in the farming region of eastern Allegany County. The farm was probably constructed by a member of the Twigg family and was known as the "Francis Twigg Farm" as late as 1909. 1

The house is of special interest in that it is very similar in both size and mode of construction to several other houses in the area. (See Historic Sites Inventory AL-III-C-038 and AL-II-A-081) All three are large "L" shaped frame buildings with gabled roofs, six over six lights and brick end chimneys all of which is typical of antebellum architecture in Allegany County. In addition, the Browning House has a particularly well preserved group of outbuildings. These include a barn, smokehouse, tool sheds, a chickenhouse and a small building located next to the main house which was used as a slave quarters.

The Browning Farm House is in fair condition and retains much of its original fabric and appearance. The comparative size of the main house in addition to the number and size of the outbuildings and slave quarters all indicate not only a certain level of prosperity but the fact that a farm such as Browning's would have remained a practically self-sufficient community.
