The Haugh House was constructed in the latter half of the 19th Century with some amount of Italianate influence. It's a typical rural dwelling, being two stories tall and three bays wide on a rectangular block. The exterior wall construction was originally frame, but has since been replaced with insul material of random ashlar stone pattern. That particular insul pattern is quite unique in Allegany County. The roof is a simple gabled one with a tin covering, and windows are the double hung wooden sash type with two over two lights and plain trim.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Haugh Frame House is located on Main Street in Oldtown, Allegany County.

The Haugh House is a two story, three bay wide, rectangular structure which was originally frame and has been covered with insul brick. The entire structure is supported by a low stone foundation with a plain water table. The roof is gabled and is covered with tin. Windows in the structure are two over two lights in a double hung wooden sash with plain trim. There are two entrances to the building located on the north and south sides. Both are plain verticle, paneled doors, and both are covered by shed-roofed porches. The rear entrance is covered by a two bay end porch while the main entrance is covered by a three bay end porch. Both are supported by Roman Doric columns. A single replaced cement block chimney is located on the outside end of the building.

The Haugh House, although it retains much of its original fabric and appearance, is unoccupied and as a result, very badly de-teriorated.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Haugh House, located on Main Street in Oldtown, is a typical example of rural architecture in Allegany County. In all probability it was constructed in the latter half of the 19th Century. Like numerous other houses in the county, it is two stories high and three bays wide with a gabled roof. The predominant architectural style in Allegany County during the second half of the 19th Century was the Italianate. The vernacular tradition would seem to be a more tailored or conservative version of this style.


