The Ruppenkamp Old Home Place (also called the Winterstine Log House) was originally log, and was built around the late 1800's. Two additions have since been added, and the whole two and a half story structure is now covered with red insul brick with replaced asphalt roofing materials. The back of the house features double hung, pegged, wooden sash windows with triangular pediments and two over two lights.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Winterstine Log House is located on the east side of Route 51 one mile east of Cumberland, Allegany County.

The Winterstine House is a rectangular structure that is two and a half stories high and four bays wide. Originally, the house was a log structure, but recently it was covered with a combination of insul brick and asphalt shingles. Two additions have been made to the house which includes a square gable roofed addition in the rear of the building and a four bay semi-enclosed porch which covers the main entrance. The roof is gabled and covered with replaced asphalt shingles. The eaves have been replaced as well. Windows in the building (with the exception of those in the two additions) are double hung, pegged, wooden sash windows with triangular pediments (on the rear of the building) and two over two lights. The original door is verticle paneled with replaced hardware. It is located on the south side of the house and is covered by the porch. The porch has a flat roof with a soffit and friezz which is supported by chamfered Roman Doric columns. The porch itself is supported by cement block pilings while the main structure rests on a low stone foundation with a plain water table. The house has a single corbeled brick chimney located in the interior of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Ruppenkamp Old Home Place was originally log, and was built around the late 1800's. It has since been covered with red insul brick and new asphalt roofing materials. Its appearance was altered even more with the addition of a four bay semi-enclosed front porch. Most of the original log homes in Allegany County have been recovered with other construction materials, such as the red insul brick used here. The present occupants rent the property and house from Frank Winterstine, who acquired the parcel in 1960.
