ca. 1895

The Grabenstein Farm House was built around 1895 by Frank Grabenstein as a simple residence for a subsistence type of farm. The house consists of a two story, three bay wide, "L" shaped structure. A shed roof covering the entire facade and numerous end porches make this structure unique to the typical style of farm house found in Allegany County. The house has been owned and inhabited by the Grabenstein family since construction until the late 1960's when Norman Filsinger purchased the property.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Grabenstein Farm House is located on the west side of the Jeffries Road near Cumberland, Allegany County, approximately .6 mile south of the Route 40 intersection.

The house basically consists of a two story, three bay wide, "L" shaped structure. A two story wing abuts the main block on the rear, western side forming the "L" of the structure. A replaced porch with hipped roof is found at the apex of the "L", and an original one story porch is placed on the northern side. The building is a frame structure, covered with novelty siding and the entire facade is supported by a low stone foundation with plain water table. The roof of the building is that of a shed which is covered with both replaced and original tin materials which has been tared. Windows in the structure feature double hung wooden sash frames with two over two and six over six lights with plain trim. The main entrance is located on the front eastern side and exhibits the original verticle paneled door with plain trim. The entrance is covered by a three bay end porch with shed roof that is supported by square columns. Three original brick chimneys are placed within the facade; two on the inside end of the main block and one on the inside end of the rear wing.

The house is structurally sound, however, it has been left vacant with the recent death of Mr. Grabenstein.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Grabenstein Farm House was built in 1895 by Frank Grabenstein as a simple residence for a subsistence type of farm. The building is similar to the common style of farm houses found in Allegany County with its two story "L" shaped frame construction. However, it is a-typical in construction in that it features a shed roof on both the main block and wing, and also exhibits front and side end porches. The home has been owned by the Grabenstein family since construction until the late 20th century when Norman Filsinger purchased the property from Leo Grabenstein, nephew of the original builder.

The house is in near original appearance and remains a cultural and architectural reminder of a way of life once found in Allegany County.
