Per 1980 correspondence between MHT and SHA, the Calvin Day House was determined eligible for the National Register, presumably as a well preserved example of modest, late 19th century farmhouse in pristine rural setting. However, based on recent information provided by SHA, the house has been subject to a number of alterations and the setting has been compromised by the construction of several new houses in the viewshed of the historic house. The Calvin Day House does not appear to retain sufficient integrity to be eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two-story house rests on a low stone basement adapted to its sloping valley site. The irregular fenestration of the principal (east) facade may reflect a series of expansions: under the shed-roofed porch which rests on turned posts, a 2/2 sash window is placed immediately left of the entrance, which itself appears left of center. Another 2/2 sash window is more widely spaced to the right of the door. On the second floor, 2/2 windows occupy the spaces directly above the left window on the first floor and immediately to the right of the entrance. The building is uniformly clad in novelty siding, and as the interior was not examined, the fenestration pattern remains unexplained. The house is one bay deep, with a shed-roofed addition to the rear. An interior end chimney rises from the peak of the south gable. The roof covering is standing-seam metal.




