The Brick Mining Buildings consist of a cluster of three brick buildings; a two story "L" shaped facade flanked by one story, square shaped structures. The facades are of American Common Bond construction and are believed to have served as stables and scales for the New Central Mining Company. The New Central Company built the structures circa 1850 and were solely responsible for the operation of the mines and the growth of the village of Midlothian.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Brick Mining Buildings are located on the east side of the Old Legislative Road in Midlothian, Allegany County, near the intersection of the road to Carlos.

The site basically consists of a cluster of three brick buildings; a two story, "L" shaped facade flanked by one story, square shaped structures. A two story wing with shed roof abuts the central building while the other two have no additions. The buildings are brick facades with American Common Bond construction. All of the structures are supported by low stone foundations with plain water tables. The roof of the central building is gabled while the two flanking buildings feature hipped roofs, and all are covered with asphalt materials. The eaves feature boxed cornices and soffit and the two end buildings exhibit louvered copulas. Windows in the buildings include double hung wooden sash frames with one over one and six over six lights with semi-circular arches and hood molds. Entrances are located on the front western faces and exhibit replaced doors. Two original corbeled brick chimneys are located to the interior of the two northern buildings, while only one is found on the southern structure.

The buildings are structurally sound but have been somewhat altered to be used for garage and storage spaces.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Brick Mining Buildings are a series of structures that were erected by the New Central Mining Company in the mid 19th century. The New Central Company owned and operated the mines in the Village of Midlothian during the mining era in the George's Creek Valley, and the mines supported a population of 398 according to the tenth U.S.G.S; census report, 1880.¹ The buildings were used for stables for the housing of workponies and also the housing of the scales for weighing the coal. In 1873, miners became convinced that the company was cheating them of their full salary and struck. The miners "complained of short weight and demanded that the scales be adjusted, that the miners be granted the privilege of placing a check weighman at the dump, and that the weight of each car be marked upon its side."² The company granted all of these demands.

To bring attention to their greivences, the miners of the New Central Company advertised their complaints in the "Frostburg Mining Journal" and also scheduled a meeting concerning the forming of a miners union.³ The forming of the union came into being and were to be known as "The Miners and Laborers Protective and Benevolent Association of Allegany Co. Maryland. The union was initiated by the workers at the Midlothian mines.

The buildings are presently in fair condition and are being used for garage space.




