The Harden farm was one of many in and around the George's Creek mining region whose products helped support a large industrial population of miners in the area.

The existence of a slaughterhouse on a farm of relatively small size is indicative of the self sufficiency of small farm operations in Allegany County early in the twentieth century. The white glazed brick chimney of the building suggests that it was also used as a smokehouse. The small board and batten structure is surrounded by a coral and a "stock" in which the animal was slaughtered.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Harden Slaughterhouse is located east of Parkersburg Road near Morantown.

The slaughterhouse consists of a small board and batten structure with a small gabled board and batten vestibule on the south. It rests on a low stone foundation of random rubble with a plain water table. The gable front roof is covered with tar paper. Eaves consist of rafter ends on the flanks and a cornice and fascia on the gabled ends.

A vertical board door with original hardware is on the vestibule offset on the south. A vertical board door with original hardware is offset on the north. The only window is a six light casement. A shed roofed frame addition on the west is covered with insulbrick siding and rests on a low foundation of random rubble. A relatively tall chimney of white glazed and brown bricks is located outside end of the addition. A stall and a fence surround the building on the east and south.
