

HAMMOND LOG HOUSE

AL-V-B-056
McMullen Highway, Robert's Place
ca. 1850

The Hammond Log House is a two bay wide, one and a half story log building that was probably constructed during the first half of the 19th century. The chinking and the notching is not visible because the house has been covered with novelty siding. Since the house is located in the fertile river valley southwest of Cumberland, it was probably used to provide shelter for a subsistence farmer and his family.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hammond Log House is located on the east side of McMullen Highway in Robert's Place, Allegany County.

The house basically consists of a two story, two bay wide, rectangular shaped log structure. A small, one story wing abuts the main block on the northeast side and is a frame addition. The entire facade is supported by a low stone foundation with a plain water table. The roof of the house is gabled and is covered with replaced asphalt materials. Eaves of the roof exhibit rafter ends and a very narrow soffit in the gable ends. The walls of the building have been covered with novelty siding and rectangular metal ventilators have been placed in the gable ends. Windows in the house include double hung wooden sash frames with six-over-six lights, and single sash frames with single lights on the second story. The main entrance of the house is located on the front, northwest side and features a replaced verticle paneled door. A shed roof hood is placed over the front entrance and the hood is supported by turned columns with scrolled brackets. A three bay end porch with shed roof is found on the rear, southeast side. The roof is supported by square columns with balustrade. One original, brick chimney is located centrally to the main block.

The house is structurally sound but has been somewhat altered since original construction.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Prior to 1825 the log cabin was the most popular form of housing in Allegany County. Since log cabins were economical, easy to construct and sturdy, this popularity was to continue throughout the first half of the 19th century.

The Hammond House is typical of the type of log building that was constructed in Allegany County before 1850. It is a one room, one and a half story structure with an original brick chimney located in the interior of the building. It is impossible to tell anything about the chinking or the notching since the building has been covered with novelty siding. Since the house is located in the fertile river valley southwest of Cumberland, it may have originally provided shelter for a subsistence farmer and his family.


