The Robertson House, which is constructed of sandstone laid in regular ashlar bond, is believed to have been built as a tavern or inn. The building is located near what used to be the Old Plank Road, a "highway" which ran from Baltimore, Maryland to Somerset, Pennsylvania.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Robertson Stone House is located on the north side of Rt. 36 near Barrelville, Allegany County, west of the Old Plank Road intersection.

The house basically consists of a one and a half story, five bay wide, "L" shaped structure. The facade is constructed of stone laid in regular ashlar bond and is supported by a stone foundation with no apparent water table. The roof of the entire facade is gabled and is covered with replaced asphalt sheeting. One gable roof dormer is located on the east side of the rear wing. Eaves of the building exhibit close verges with fascia and boxed cornices. Windows in the house include pegged, double hung wooden sash frames with six-over-six and nine-over-six lights. Windows surrounds include plain trim and stone lintels. The main entrance is located on the front south side and features a replaced paneled door and plain trim. The door is recessed the width of the walls. Two remaining entrances are located on either side of the wing forming the "L" to the structure. A one bay portico with shed roof is placed over the front entrance, and the roof is supported by square posts. A similar shed roof porch is placed on the apex of the "L", while a small gabled hood supported by brackets covers the remaining entrance. Four replaced chimneys are found within the facade. One cement block chimney is located on the outside end of the rear wing, while two corbeled brick chimneys are located to the interior of the wing. The remaining chimney is an enameled, corbeled brick one which is located centrally to the main block.

The house is structurally sound, however it has been somewhat altered since original construction.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Robertson Stone house is believed to have been constructed circa 1845 of locally abundant sandstone. The house is one of a very few stone structures in Allegany County that are laid in regular ashlar bond, and thus far in the survey it is the only one and a half story, stone structure of this bond type. It is believed that the stone building was originally constructed to serve as a tavern and inn along the Old Plank Road. ¹ The road is said to have traveled parallel and to the rear of the stone facade. ² The taverns of this time period offered food, drink, and accommodations for travelers, and also served as an important social center for the community. ³

The stone house is structurally sound but somewhat altered; however, it remains an architectural reminder of a way of life once found in Allegany County.


