

AL-V-B-095
Dressman Brick House
Cash Valley Road, La Vale
Ca. 1850's

This handsome brick structure laid in American Common Bond is one of at least three houses located in Cash Valley constructed during the 1850's featuring wide soffits, boxed cornices with return ends and using a six to one variation in the brick work. (See AL-V-B-091, AL-V-B-092). This leads one to believe that all were built by the same person. The Dressman Brick House retains much of its original appearance and serves as a good example of practical architecture which was used in this area.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Dressman Brick House is located on the Cash Valley Road near La Vale, Allegany County.

The building basically consists of two story, three bay wide, "T" shaped structure. One part is a two story frame addition with novelty siding. The main part is brick, laid in American Common Bond with a six to one variation. Wall features are plain. The building is supported by a high stone foundation featuring a stone beveled water table. The roof of the house is gable flank; covered with asphalt shingles; replaced. Eaves of the roof exhibit boxed cornices with wide soffit. Square shaped louvered ventilators are located in each peak of each gable. Windows in the house are double hung with wooden sash frames and one-over-one and six-over-six lights. Window trim features Plain lintels and lugsills. The one chimney in the house is original; made of brick with corbeled caps and located inside end. The main entrance faces southeast and features fake pilasters and fake dentilated pediment surrounding a six paneled door. The house has two porches. The umbrage porch has a wooden floor with wrought iron railing, and lattice work that surrounds the base. The front porch is a three-bay wide, open porch with hip roof, supported by double cushion roman doric capital columns and lattice work surrounds the base.

The house is structurally sound, however it has been somewhat altered since original construction but is in good condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In 1833, Dr. Samuel P. Smith was granted land in the Cash Valley area known as "Wednesday's Work" and "Woodlands." ¹ Dr. Smith served as a surgeon for the U.S. Army during the Civil War. ² At the war's end Dr. Smith began selling his properties, The "Woodlands" and part of "Wednesday's Work" being sold in 1865 to Anne Bruce and her husband David for a large sum of money. ³ The cost of these properties would suggest that the large brick house located on the "Woodlands" tract was built by Doctor Smith during the 1850's. The Bruces sold "Woodlands" to Bernhard Dressman in the year 1871. ⁴ The brick house and land known as the "Woodlands" remained in the Dressman family for at least 100 years.

This handsome brick structure, laid in American Common Bond, was constructed in a "T" shape with gabled flanks and gable end at the base of the "T". Louvered ventilators are located in the gabled flanks. The porch at the main entrance features four wooden cushioned pilasters. The chimney, with corbeled cap, is original and located inside end. A second story frame addition to apex of the "T" creates an umbrage porch on the side, a feature that is unusual for this area.

The Dressman Brick House retains much of its original appearance and serves as a good example of practical architecture, enhancing the cultural heritage of Allegany County.


