During the earlier half of the nineteenth century Joseph Dilley bought several tracts of land, creating the Greenpoint Farm near the National Road immediately west of the Narrows. A frame house, probably built by Dilley, served as a farmhouse and was occupied by the subsequent owners. The brick house on the farm was built in the late 1880's by George Clauson.

The square brick farmhouse is five bays wide on the south with a flat roofed portico in the center of that facade. The low hipped roof is bracketed. The house is structurally sound and retains its original appearance.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Greenpoint Farm Brick House is located on the Greenpoint Road in northern LaVale.

The building consists of a square, two story, five bays wide brick structure laid in american common bond in a variation of six stretchers to one header. It rests on a low stone foundation of rock-faced ashlar with a plain water table. The low hipped roof is covered with ribbed tin with snowboards. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, and bed mould with decorative brackets. Wall features include a five-sided bay window with a bracketed flat roof on the east. Three brick chimneys are corbeled, two are located inside end and one is on the interior.

The main entrance in the center of the southern facade includes a two light transom and a set of double doors each with original hardware, one semicircular arched light, and one square recessed panel. Windows are pegged, two over two lights with wooden lugsills and flat brick arches. Windows of the bay window are narrow one over one lights. The portico on the south has a bracketed flat roof supported by square wooden posts, two of which have decorative brackets. The larger hipped roof porch on the north has been enclosed.


