**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

St. Joseph's School faces south on Church Hill in Midland. It consists of a one and a half story frame structure abutted by a one story hipped roofed addition on the facade. A finished basement is also included within the structure, which rests upon a low stone and cement block foundation with a beveled water table. Very well kept novelty siding comprises the exterior walls. Large four over four double hung wooden sash frames are found in the main block; double hung sashes with one over one lights make up the windows in the front addition. The south-facing front entrance is served by a nine stair wooden landing set up to accommodate the grade which slopes from north to south. Over that same door is a transom light, a gabled dormer containing a cross at the top and a gothic sash ventilator surrounded by wooden fish scale shingling. There is also a rear, northeast entrance enclosed by a one bay shed roofed addition. Both entrances have their original horizontal paneled doors. The roof over the main block is hipped and covered by replaced asphalt shingling; a soffit underlies the eaves. The school features one original corbeled brick chimney with an outside end location.

St. Joseph's School stands very similar to the way it looked when built in 1900, is structurally sound and is in excellent condition.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

St. Joseph's Parish dates back to 1891 when it became the first Catholic Church in Midland. An architect from Baltimore by the name of Stack drew up the plans for the building, which was built rather rapidly due to the desire of the people in the little coal mining town of Midland to have their own church. The Rev. Peter Manning of St. Mary's in Lonaconing held the First Holy Mass on Christmas Day of 1891. In 1898, the Parish received its first resident pastor, an Italian Priest of Noble birth - Reverend Don Luigi Sartori.

Of particular significance to the St. Joseph's Parish are the three bells in which Don Luigi Sartori had installed in the Church Tower in 1898. The largest weighs 2000 pounds, has a diameter of 46 inches, and rings out an E natural. They were cast by the McShane Bell Foundry of Baltimore.

A new larger church was completed in 1967. The bells mentioned above were all that was left when the original church was torn down. A memorial was placed in front of the property, which includes the original three bells, which have been refinished, electrified, and remounted.

St. Joseph's School was founded in 1899 by Father Don Luigi Sartori, for his belief was that "real education should prepare for the eternal as well as the temporal." On August 16, 1899, a group of Notre Dame Sisters arrived in Midland. Sister Mary Thomasine was the first superior of the school, which had 200 students its first year of existence. Today the institution still prospers.
