The Lonaconing Bakery was constructed in the last decades of the 19th century after the great fire of Lonaconing. Today it stands as a good example of a 19th century commercial shop front and is of special interest because of its elaborate cornice and frieze.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lonaconing Bakery is located at 26 Main Street, Lonaconing, Allegany County.

The Lonaconing Bakery is a two story, three bay wide, rectangular building constructed of brick laid in American Common Bond. The building rests on a low stone foundation and has a bracketed shed roof. Windows on the second story are double hung, wooden sash frames with two over two lights and jack arches. Both second story windows and a second story entrance, which has been replaced, open onto a bracketed balcony. Windows on the first floor are large show windows. The main entrance is located between the show windows and features a replaced door with a glass panel and a large transom light. The most interesting feature of the bakery is the roofline. Located directly above the second story windows are three recessed panels. These are topped by a frieze of stylized scallop shells which in turn are topped by a heavy bracketed cornice with a cross gable.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

On September 7, 1881 the Town of Lonaconing suffered its worst fire in decades. The blaze started in a stable and in three hours, fifty three buildings had burnt to the ground. As a result of the fire, the majority of the town was rebuilt during the last decade of the 19th century.

It is not known how much damage the Lonaconing Bakery building may have suffered in the blaze. However, the building stands today as a good example of a Queen Anne commercial structure. The present owner believes the building may have been a confectionary prior to its becoming a bakery.


