1870's

Charlestown Schoolhouse was built in the late 1870's when many schoolhouses were being built in western Allegany County. By the 1880's there was at least one public school in each community of the Georges's Creek mining region. Like most of the schoolhouses built at this time the Charlestown Schoolhouse is frame with a hipped roof. It originally had two front entrances and tall pedimented windows.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Charlestown Schoolhouse is located near Jackson Run southeast of Lonaconing.

This two room schoolhouse consists of a rectangular one story, four bays wide frame structure with weatherboarding. The low foundation is of random ashlar and rubble stone with a plain water table. The hipped roof is covered with tar paper. Eaves consist of boxed cornice, soffit, and bedmould. A corbeled brick chimney in the center of the building is original.

There were originally two entrances on the north. One has been removed but the other includes a five panel door with original hardware. Most windows have been altered but three. Three over one light windows may be original. A gabled vestibule on the north has been removed.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The public school system of Allegany County was established in 1865, but it was not until the 1870's that adequate schoolhouses were erected. (1) Until that time some coal companies provided for the education of the children in the Georges' Creek mining area.(2) " Once the school building program really began, the mining areas were well looked after." (3)"By 1881 every community had at least one public schools." (4)

Charlestown Schoolhouse was built in the late 1870's when the citizens of the area were actively engaged in "fund raising and building programs." (5) In 1881 the two room schoolhouse was run by Ella McCaffree (6). Like most of the schoolhouses built in the western part of the county at the time this building has a hipped roof and originally had two front entrances and tall pedimented windows. Although drastically altered the Charlestown Schoolhouse is a reflection of the progress of public education in Allegany County.
