


AL-VI-B-254

mid-late 19th century


This 5-bay wide vernacular frame house has a gable roof with a bracketed cornice and raking cornices, and the gable ends have cornice returns. The 2/2 sash windows have molded tops. The hip-roofed front porch also has a bracketed cornice, and the square posts have corner brackets. The center door has a 4-light transom and 2-light sidelights. The house appears to be covered with German siding.

The Upholt house is situated off the main street of the small mining village called Gilmore, in the center of the Georges Creek coal region. It is possible that Gilmore was a company town owned by the Midland Coal and Iron Company, whose offices, store, and dumphouse were located there, Midland being 1/2 mile to the north.


