**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The frame house is situated in a hilly area on Miller Road approximately 1/2 mile east of Rt. 36. It is a two story, three bay by one bay gable roof structure with a two bay deep ell. A single story shed addition is located along the inside elevation of the ell. A single story, two bay by one bay gable roof modern additon is located at the rear of the ell.

The house has an exterior cinderblock chimney at the rear elevation of the main block. Two over two sash windows light the house. The house rests on a poured concrete foundation. The facade is covered with aluminum siding while the rest of the house is covered with insul brick, asphalt shingles. The roof is covered with corrugated metal with tar paper over that.

A bank barn resting on a stone foundation with an enclosed forebay with round windows added and a corncrib next to it are also located on the property.


