DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>The house is located on the easterly side of Decatur Street, south of Davidson Street and diagonally across from the intersection of Charles Street, in Cumberland, Allegany County, Maryland. The house sets back several feet from Decatur Street and stands to the north of the former Sacred Heart Hospital building, now a factory. The property, known as 301 Decatur Street, rises in an easterly direction.</p> <p>The house, which abuts the house to the north, is a three story, brick structure with a brick foundation and a one story wing with a stone foundation on the southerly side. The major architectural features of the exterior are the end walls extended above the roof line, a brick cornice, a masonry belt course (probably of stone) between the second and third floors, and an internal chimney on the northerly side of the house. The bond of the brick appears to be American Common although the exterior walls have several coats of paint, that help to obscure the bond. The tops of the end walls are capped with what appear to be terra-cotta tiles of recent vintage.</p> <p>The facade, westerly side, has three bays with the entrance in the southerly bay of the first floor. The front windows have wooden sills, plain wooden lintels, and double-hung wooden sashes. The windows of the first and second floors have six-over-six lights while those of the third floor have three-over-three lights. The entranceway is framed with a broad flat trim with applied flat molding on the outer edge and crossettes below a pediment. The frame tapers from the bottom to the top in the Egyptian manner. The door has six panels with flat, applied molding and a bead down the center of the full-length of the door. There is a transom with three lights above the door. The stairway leading to the entrance is made of stone, possibly red sandstone.</p> <p>The one story wing on the southerly side is set back a few feet from the facade and has a low pitch roof. The wing has large openings for doors and windows, one each on the westerly and easterly sides, and two along the southerly side, with arch tops. These openings and the shape of the wing are outlined with raised bricks. A frame porch with two free standing columns and a balustrade with turned balusters on south side is attached to the front of the wing and rests on two square columns of brick. Both the porch and the wing may date after construction of the main portion. The decorative detailing of the porch is of a type characteristic of the late nineteenth century. The construction of the wing, particularly the stone foundation, is not consistent with that of the house.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Deneen-Davidson house is significant for its history and architecture. Although the exact date of construction is unknown, the house appears to have been built in the mid-nineteenth century. The building is identified on an 1850 map of Cumberland as belonging to a Davidson. The Davidson family sold the property in 1858. The property was purchased in 1897 by John Deneen whose family retained it until 1973 when the present owner acquired it.

Architecturally, the Deneen-Davidson house represents the transition from the Neo-classical to the Greek Revival as found in townhouse construction of the mid-nineteenth century in Cumberland. The transition is evident in external features of the building. The house is similar in design to that of the house to the north at 303 Decatur Street. (A1-IV-009).








