The Beveredge Frame House is located on Temperance Row in Barton. In 1873 A.B. SHaw sold the lot this house is built on to Russel Beveredge and Hugh McGrady. The house was built in 1876 by Beveredge. The original portion of this building is a rectangular two story, five bays wide frame structure. Telescoping gabled frame additions have been added to the northern facade. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bedmould, frieze returns, and scrolled brackets.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Beveredge Frame House is located on the northern side of Temperance Row in Barton.

The original portion of this building is a rectangular two story, five bays wide frame structure covered with insul brick siding. Telescoping gabled frame additions have been added to the northern facade. The building rests on a high stone foundation of random rubble with a plain water table. The gable flank roof and the roofs of the additions are covered with ribbed tin. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould, frieze, returns and scrolled brackets. One original brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located inside end. A replaced chimney on the original is also inside end. An outside end cinderblock chimney on the first addition is outside end.

The pedimented main entrance in the center of the southern facade includes a two light transom and door of two panels and one light with original hardware. An entrance on the north is also pedimented with a transom. Windows are pegged six over six light sashes with slipsills. A steeply hipped porch roof on the south covered with ribbed tin is supported by square wooden posts. A shed roofed porch on the north is partially enclosed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Beveredge Frame House is located on Temperance Row in Barton. Barton was originally part of the 1,200 acre estate of the Reverend William Shaw. The Reverend's son, William Shaw Jr., began laying out the town in 1853. He named the town after his fathers birthplace, Barton, England. The town originally had 66 lots, and in 1868 A.B. Shaw, William Shaw Jr's son, added 51 additional lots. (1)

In 1873 A.B. Shaw sold the lot this house is built on to Russel Beveredge and Hugh McGrady. (2) The house was built in 1876 by Beveredge. (3)

The original portion of this building is a rectangular two story, five bays wide frame structure. Telescoping gabled frame additions have been added to the northern facade. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould, frieze, returns, and scrolled brackets.

Both entrances are pedimented and have transoms.


