A banked barn on a stone foundation, a banked frame granary also on a stone foundation, a springhouse and a stone spring are among the outbuildings located on the property.

 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a hilly area on Stoney Run Road approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from Rt. 36. It is a two story three bay by one bay structure with a gable roof and a one bay by three bay ell. A wooden porch supported by large square posts with square balustrades covers the facade. A two tiered porch of the same construction as the facade porch is located across the inside elevation of the ell. A small one bay square addition is located at the rear elevation of the structure under the second tier of the porch. The house is entered from the central facade entrance and from an entrance at the rear end of the first tier of the porch and on the inside end of the second tier of the porch.

The house has a central brick chimney of the main block and another on the ell. The cellar is entered from the porch side of the main block. The main block rests on a stone foundation, the ell on a poured concrete foundation. Weatherboard siding framed with cornerboards covers the house. Tar paper covers the roof.

A banked barn on a stone foundation, a banked frame granary also on a stone foundation, a springhouse and a stone spring are among the outbuildings located on the property.


