The C&P Tunnel was built in 1857 as a connecting underground route through Frostburg. The tunnel was a major engineering accomplishment and served as an important link for hauling bulk loads of coal as well as passengers. It is a semi-circular arched opening that is constructed throughout in American Common Bond brick and surfaced with unsmoothed cement.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Cumberland & Pennsylvania Tunnel is located under Frostburg, Allegany County. The northern terminus begins approximately at the site of the Depot Hotel, 20 Depot Street, and extends South to Center Street which is the southern terminus near the Bowery Street bridge.

The tunnel is a semicircular arched opening that is constructed throughout in American Common bond brick and surfaced with unsmoothed cement. The tunnel is no longer in use; the tracks have been removed and "No Trespassing" signs have been posted which restricts investigation.

The tunnel is rapidly deteriorating but still retains much of its original appearance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The C & P Tunnel was built in 1857 as a connecting underground route through Frostburg. The route connected the former divisions, the "Mt. Savage & Cumberland," and the "Georges Creek Coal & Iron Company" railroads between the points from Cumberland to Piedmont. Later, in 1864 the two railroads united to form the "Cumberland & Pennsylvania Railroad," still connecting the same two points.

The tunnel was a major engineering accomplishment in 1857, and served as an important link for hauling bulk loads of coal and transportation for some passengers. The tunnel is in deteriorated condition, however, its role as a connection point of railroads, which was the major mode of transportation in Western Maryland during this time period, certainly makes it significant historically. The possible restoration of this site would certainly enhance the cultural and architectural heritage of Frostburg.


