Situated on a hill at the end of Harley Station Road, the Pumphrey House is another typical two-story, frame farmhouse, five bays across. The entrance porch has a curved roof decorated with Chinese lattice work. The old W. B. and A. Railroad tracks are near the entrance to the property. One of the few large tracts of land in a highly commercial area, the house is believed to be slated for demolition.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Louis Pumphrey House sits on a hill at the end of Marley Station Rd, less than a mile from Rt. 2 (Governor Ritchie Highway). The house faces east with a circular drive in front of it. The old Baltimore and Annapolis Railway tracks are about 300 feet from the entrance. farmhouse

It is a mid to late 19th century frame dwelling, two stories high and five bays wide, with a gable flank roof and inside end chimneys. Covered with weatherboard, the house faces east. A two story kitchen ell with a tall inside end chimney is on the south side of the rear elevation, abutted by a three bay, two story wing with a shed roof and porches cut out of either end.

A one story entrance porch with an arched roof supported by plain columns shelters the center bay. An unusual chinese railing fills the front opening of the arched roof. In addition, a one story porch with a flat roof and balustrade is on the north flank and an enclosed porch is on the south flank.

The main entrance is in the center bay, east elevation. It has an eight-light transom and sidelights.

Windows, containing 6/6 light, double-hung sash, are arranged uniformly on the principal facade as well as the other elevations.

The roof has a medium pitch with boxed eaves and ventilated gables on the main block. It is covered with asphalt shingles.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Located near Rt. 2, in the vicinity of Glen Burnie, and probably slated for demolition, The Louis Pumphrey house is one of the last old farmhouses in an area which once supported numerous truck farms. Advantageously located next to the Marly Station, <sup>the farms</sup> produce such as tomatoes, cantalopes and strawberries were loaded on the train and shipped to Baltimore. A general store run by a member of the Pumphrey family was also at the station. The house is in very shabby condition today. It is a C. 1860 frame I house, two stories high and five bays wide, with a summer kitchen on the rear. The arched roof of the porch has an unusual chinese lattice decoration.
