The house is located on Queen Anne Bridge Road, approximately 1/4 mile west of the intersection with Wayson Road. The house, which faces north, is on a slight rise, approximately 2,000 feet south of the road. It is a two-and-one-half-story structure with a two-story wing at the rear. The outside has been covered with asbestos shingles. The gabled roof has grey asphalt shingles. The foundation is brick.

The front facade is the gable end of the house. The front has three bays and a central door with windows on each side. The door has three narrow, vertical panels and six small lights at the top. It is flanked by side windows of four narrow lights and a solid panel at the bottom of each. The double-hung windows are six-over-six. The panes are long, approximately 15 inches by 8 inches. The window and door frames are simple rounded jambs with quarter-round mouldings applied to the edge, giving a deep beaded effect. There are shutter hinges.

The second floor has three bays of smaller six-over-six, double-hung windows directly above the first floor bays. Centered in the gable on the third floor is a four-over-four, double-hung window flanked by small two-over-two windows.

On the front is a one-story shed roofed porch (eight feet wide). It starts two feet from the west corner of the house and extends 38 feet across the front, continuing around the corner and along the east side 32 feet to the corner of the main section. Across the front are five turned posts. Each has a six-inch square, two-and-one-half-feet-high bottom section, a turned section, a square top section, and a simple crown moulding. Decorative brackets are on each side of the posts. Three posts of the same design are along the east side. Two pilasters of the same design are where the porch is attached to the house. The porch has a plain boxed cornice with an older crown moulding, a newer moulding. On the ceiling is beaded (wainscoting type) paneling. The floor is narrow wood boards which are mitered at the east corner. Brick pillars are under the porch. On the east side is framing for screening.

Since the front facade is the gable end, the cornice return and rake board are on the front. The rake board consists of double boards applied to give a beaded appearance in the middle. The cornice is a plain boxed one with a quarter-round bed moulding and crown moulding that appears to be 20th century window and door framing.

The east facade of the main section is three bay. In the center and to the left are large six-over-nine, double-hung windows, with large panes. On the right is a smaller six-over-six window. The frame on these windows has only the rounded jamb without the extra moulding used on the front. On the second floor are three bays of six-over-six windows centered above the first floor windows.

On the south side of the main section is a two-story wing. According to the owner, the wing predates the main section. A pair of brick chimneys is located approximately midway each side of the main section. The one on the right (east) side has been partially covered by the wing, whereas the one on the left side is an exterior chimney. The top one-third of the exterior one has been rebuilt with new brick. In the gable between the chimneys are a pair of small four-over-four windows.

The first floor of the west side has three bays--three six-over-six windows. On the second floor are three smaller six-over-six windows directly above the first floor ones. The foundation, which is visible on this side, is concrete over brick.

On the south side of the main section is a two-story wing, which has an enclosed porch on the west side.


The east facade of the wing is two-bay, a door on the left and a small four-over-four window on the right. The door is a new French door. On the second floor is a six-over-six window, slightly to the left of the door, plus a six-over-six window directly above the small first-floor window.

On the south gabled-end of the wing is a bulkhead to the basement. It has brick sides and steps. A jalousie-type window is on the left side. On the second floor is a small four-over-four window located to the right of the first-story window. An interior chimney is centered in the gable. The wing has a plain rake board on this gabled end. It has a plain cornice with only a simple crown moulding.

On the west side of the wing has been added a newer enclosed porch. On the south end of the porch are three metal windows. Along the west side are five metal windows to the right of the door and one to the left of the door. The door is old board and batten with a crystal knob. On the second floor are two six-over-six windows.

<p>The "Glenstrae Farm" house is a simple 2-part frame structure. The kitchen wing (ca. 1840) was, according to the owner, the first house on the property. It has 2 storys with one room and a narrow stair hall on each floor. The chimney (rebuilt) is at the opposite end from the hall.</p> <p>The 2 1/2 story main house (ca. 1890) is an unusual adaptation of the traditional side-hall, double-parlor plan. The 'front' of the house is the north gable end (the roof ridge runs north to south). The entrance would traditionally be on the either the east or west side of this building. Instead, it is in the center of the north side and opens into the middle of the hall which runs east to west. Two large exterior chimneys on the south side serve the dining room and living room. The dining room mantel is dark marble. The interior moldings are the typical 19th century design of square corners with medallions. The dining room windows are tall, 6 over 9's.</p> <p>The original wood siding on the exterior of the house has been covered with asbestors shingle and the shutters have been removed.</p> <p>The house appears on the 1878 map of the county as owned by a Dr. Durvall. A small graveyard on the property contains the marked stones of several Duvalls and also several of their predecessors.</p>
