DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

"Loch Eden", a simple, 2 story, frame house, stands on a hill above Route 258. It is a long, rectangular building with an A-roof of slight pitch. The earliest, and principal, portion of the house has four bays and is between two large chimneys. An addition, on the north end of the house, encloses the chimney and continues the same roof-line. Another part of the house, on the south end, has been torn down. The end wall is now covered in stucco and has a variety of oddly shaped and positioned windows. The house in its present form, is awkwardly proportioned and more quaint than beautifyl in appearance.

There is a small graveyard behind the house containing uncut granite markers. There are few notable plantings except one magnificent old elm tree standing to the north of the house.

The house is recorded on the 1860 and 1878 county maps as owned by J.C. Weems and Franklin Weems respectively. A letter, written at "Loch Eden" on the 17th of February, 1854, by John Crompton Weems describes some of the history of the house and its occupants. The letter was addressed to, his second cousing, once removed, Doctor David G. Weems of Tracy's Landing. John Weems, at age 77, was recording from his memory "the generation of our ancestors", and, despite certain inaccuracies, the letter makes interesting reading.

The story begins in Scotland with the Battle between Malcolm and MacBeth for the crown. "John the youngest son of McDuff who killed McBeth behaved with so much chivalry in that contest as to gain"... recognition. He was given the Earlship of Weems and one of his youngest sons married a Miss Lock whose brother (Dr. William Loch) emigrated to Maryland sometime in the 17th centure. "After living to be quite an old man and unmarried he returned to Scotland and with his sister's consent brought back with him our aforesaid grandfathers (David and James Weems, sons of Miss Loch and of the son of the first Earl of Weems, to inherit his very large estate in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. Sometime thereafter however Dr. William Loch married a lady upwards of 50 years of age to comfort and assist in taking care of and to sooth his gouty system in his advanced life but contrary no doubt to both their expectations she brough him a son William Loch Jr. in her 51st year." Severl generations later the question of proper inheritance of the property was settled in a suit between John Weems, the father of J.C. Weems, and a certain William Chew the grandson of William Lock Jr.". Chew won the case and sold the property back to Weems.

The letter therefore explains the name "Loch Eden" and also mentions that the house burned in 1839. Though several centuries were omitted between John McDuff's reward and William Loch's arrival in Maryland, the more recent events can be assumed to be fairly accurate.

A photostatic copy of the letter is owned by Mrs. Charles Dodds of St. Margarets, Maryland. The location of the original is not known.
