DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>"Woodside" is situated at the end of a long lane, lined with maple trees. The name suits the house well, as a deep ravine and dense woods border it on the west. The main section is frame, 2 1/2 storys, and dates from about 1860. Clemence Cheston Burnwell believes that the same man who built her former home in Owensville ("Smith's Purchase", AA-36-Q-e) may also have done this house. It is similar in plan, with the entrance in the center of three bays and the stair crossing the front windows, but the exterior details are quite different. "Woodside" has large-paned windows, hung 2-over-2. The center bay projects about a foot from the rest of the facade and is covered by a gable with a small arched window. A pair of tall arched windows on the second floor opens onto a wide balcony over the porch. The window and porch trim and the heavy bracketed cornice are reminiscent of "Victorian" work.</p> <p>Set into the ravine below the main section of the house is a long 3-story wing. Its ground floor, built of brick, connects with the basement of the other. The two floors above are frame. This wing is probably the older of the two sections. Its entrance is on the opposite side where there is a two story porch. Two large chimneys serve the narrow rooms. The first and second floor windows have 6-over-6 panes. The third floor has tiny 4 pane windows placed just under the eaves.</p> <p>The house appears on the 1878 map of the county as owned by William Claytor. Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Clagett lived there for many years. It is now occupied only by a care taker.</p>
