ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL OR STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Basically square pile in plan with inset massive chimneys, belt course at second floor, excellent modillioned and molded cornice at eaves of hipped roof, windows at second floor of all facades and first of front have splayed brick arches, others at first floor with segmental arches; transom lit entrance has smaller flanking side windows and wood stoop, later, with wrought iron rails.

Front entrance with addition of Victorian porch, now removed.


STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

Excellent example of brick pile style Georgian, restored, with exceptional cornice and Flemish bond brickwork. Important as a type and critical to streetscape, especially in relation to Jonas Green house across Charles Street.

Built by William Adams, Delegate from Somerset County, sold at his death to William Kilty, Chancellor of Maryland.



NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION <p style="text-align: right;">OPEN TO PUBLIC <input type="checkbox"/> no</p> <p>133 (131) Charles Street is a rectangular Georgian block similar to the Ridout House, Upton Scott House, and other Annapolis houses of the period. Present owners restored and remodelled the house 5 or 8 years ago. Built of Flemish bond, there is a simple water table, 4 course brick ^{half round} cornice, and a simple classical cornice with modillions and dentils which extends completely around the house. There is a slightly sloping hipped roof with two huge chimneys that face the street (see Acton). Windows are small and have interior shutters and splayed brick lintels. Most windows are 6/6 and the side ones have elliptical brick arches. Window arrangement is not symmetrical and front door has odd single pane transom. A handsome, historic, academic house. Definitely, should be preserved.</p>
