

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC yes

The Court of Appeals Building was built in 1901 by the architects of the west section of the State House (1902) and originally housed most of the state offices. A strictly Neo-Classic structure, the Appeals Building could be straight ^{flow} ~~for~~ a plate of Palladio, a more likely Palladio as interpreted by Inigo Jones, for this building is very much like Jones' Banqueting House at Whitehall. It has a projecting pavillion with 5 unfluted Ionic oolumns. The 1st storey windows are especially Italianate with their triangular pediments; cornice and other details are also classical. Well built, and though unabashedly eclectic, adds to Annapolis.
