Adams M.E. Church was built in 1883. It stands 20' from the south side of Bayard Road in a totally agrarian area of southern Anne Arundel County. A new brick church has been built next to the old structure and it houses a large and active congregation. At the rear of the old church is a graveyard that contains the remains of J. Harrison Holt. Holt, a wealthy farmer, was one of the members most responsible for the building of the new church and the preservation of the old building. Holt died in 1971, he had donated land to the Methodist Church for use as a camp and had allowed his farm to be used as the site for a number of fund raising activities.

The old church is a weatherboard building that measures 18' across the front. The building has a simple two-step entrance with double doors with a small clear-glass palladin arc top. There are two eight foot (8') lancet windows in the front facade, one at each side of the doors. Three of these windows are on each side of the main body of the church. The windows contain a combination of colored and clear glass.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Adams M.E. Church is a simple weatherboard sided late Victorian structure that stands 20' from the south side of Bayard Road in a totally agrarian area of souther Anne Arundel county. The old church measures only 18' across the front and is 32' long. The entrance is merely two fold-down wooden steps rising to double doors with a small clear glass palladin arc atop. There are two eight-foot lancet windows in the front facade, one at each side of the double doors. Three of these windows are on each side of the body of the church (six in all). The windows contain a combination of colored and clear glass.

A new brick church has been built on the east side of the old structure. Luckily, there is a drive and some 15' of lawn separating the two buildings. At the rear of the old church is the graveyard.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Adams M.E. Church is located in an area of southern Anne Arundel County that is still virtually all tobacco land. The landscape is dotted with tobacco barns and the old farm houses stand well back from the road surrounded by the farm land. This Church was built and used by black farmers and farm laborers . It is an extremely active parish and the new church has a large congregation. At the rear of the old Church is the graveyard that contains the remains of J.Harrison Holt, a wealthy farmer, who was one of the members most responsible for the building of the new church and the preservation of the old church. Holt, who died in 1971, had donated land to the Methodist Church for use as a camp and had allowed his farm to be used as the site for a number of fund raising activities.


