DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 1 1/2 story, L-shaped house is three bays wide by one bay deep and faces south. An ell, two bays wide, extends to the north. The building is clad in wood shingles, with asphalt covering its gable roof.

The principal (south) facade has doorways in both the central and east bays, under a screened porch with a half-hipped roof and exposed rafter ends. A window occupies the west bay of the ground floor. On the half-story, there is a 3/3 sash window in the west bay, and a 6/6 in the east.

The west gable has a central 6/6 window in the half-story, over a smaller window opening on the ground floor. A Brick exterior chimney stands to the left of the windows. The north wall of the main block and the west wall of the ell both have a 3/3 window centered under the eaves and a somewhat larger opening directly below. A similar pattern of fenestration defines the two bays of the east wall of the ell. A one-story shed addition abuts the north gable of the ell; above this, a large window opening lights the half-story. An interior chimney rises from the peak of the roof in the center of the ell.


