The Earl Patterson House and Shed are located on the west side of Gambrills Road, just south of the abandoned Annapolis & Elkridge (WB&A) Railroad bed. The house is a two-story frame cross gable house with a rear ell. The frame shed, which stands southwest of the house, is covered with board and batten siding and was probably constructed as a stable. Immediately southwest of the house, between it and the shed/stable, is a boundary stone marking one of the Hammonds' tracts, surveyed in 1790.

The house is a two-story frame cross gable house with a rear ell. It has been altered significantly on the exterior and more so on the interior. The frame shed, which stands southwest of the house, is covered with board and batten siding and was probably constructed as a stable. Immediately southwest of the house, between it and the shed/stable, is a boundary stone marking one of the Hammonds' tracts, surveyed in 1790. Approximately one mile southwest of the boundary stone stood Hammond's Manor (AA-172) until it was destroyed by fire in 1980.



According to the present owner, the Earl Patterson House was once operated as a store by the Maynard and Miller families. By the late 19th century a small cross-roads village known as Gambrills had developed around the Annapolis & Elkridge Railroad and the intersection of Route 175. A station and Post Office were established and several stores flourished.
