

PIKESVILLE PUBLIC SCHOOL - 1878 - 102-104 Old Court Road, west of Mettam Memorial Baptist Church. A second frame school house was built on a lot purchased from the owner of Annandale estate (which became Druid Ridge Cemetery). The first teacher was Louis H. Caldwell, nephew of John Greenleaf Whittier. Brick additions were made in 1878 and 1885. Sold by Board of Education and converted to a private home in 1915 (duplex). [Possibly enlarged in 1897 under plan by Albert S. Watts.]
