**MOUNT WILSON SANITARIUM** - 1875 - Mount Wilson Lane, 1.5 miles west of Reisterstown Road. The Thomas Wilson Sanitarium for Children of Baltimore City was established on 165 acres of woodland along Gwynns Falls on the tract called "Antietam" near Rogers Station. The institution opened in 1893. Children were brought from the city for day excursions and others stayed in cottages and pavilions. In 1924, the State acquired the property and expanded into treatment of adult TB patients. An 8-story brick hospital was opened in 1951 at a cost of \$3 million. Ornate barn and a nearby 2-story Victorian dwelling survive near the power plant; also patient pavilions, and a large Queen Anne Revival mansion. Victorian garden building, as well as recent brick office and residential buildings.
