Originally known as Black Rock Mills, Kensey Johns' Mill is on the site of an earlier grist mill owned by Thomas Matthews. Matthews' widow sold it in 1794 to Richard Johns. The name of Johns' son, Kensey, appears on the datestone which gives the date 1800 as the date for the present structure. The mill operated as a mill until the 1930's. The architecture of the mill is typical of its type as demonstrated by the use of multiple doors on all storeys of the gable ends, and the single corner chimney.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Close to the east side of the Falls Road, between it and a northerly branch of Western Run, the Kensey Johns Mill is a stone structure, three bays in length. Its north end is one and one-half storeys in height as is about half of its west front; grade falls to the south and east, allowing its south end and east front to be two and one-half storeys in height. Centered doors are in both storeys of the north end, the lower one being flanked by a 6/6 window. Another entrance is in the middle bay of the west front and a 6/6 window is in each flanking bay. Doors are centered in the principal and basement storeys of the south end, again with a single window on either side. In the south gable, 6/6 windows flank a datestone with the inscription which appears to be

but the last two digits of the date are less distinct than the name.

Only the ends of the east facade, facing the water, are of stone, the entire central portion being of frame covered with wood shingles; the absence of quoins at the inner ends of the stone east wall suggests that the frame infill replaces a missing original construction.

Stone jack arches support masonry above each opening. A stone chimney rises flush with the southwest corner of the structure. The interior of the structure was not examined.

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### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Kensey Johns' Mill was known as Black Rock Mills. It is on the site of an earlier grist mill owned by Thomas Matthews and sold by his widow in 1794 to Richard Johns. The name of Kensey Johns, son of Richard, appears on the date stone which gives 1800 as the date for the present structure.

Operated as a mill until the 1930's, this building still contains one of the French burr millstones now used as a hearth in the lower of two apartments which have been constructed in modern times.

Across the Falls Road to the west stands a dwelling which was once the miller's home. The earliest section is believed to have been built contemporaneously with the mill. It was enlarged at least three times, but the original windows are still in place. The building had various uses: as a store, a public house and a post office. At one time it was the lodge for a summer cottage community. It is now occupied as a single family dwelling.

Gray's Rocky Lodge appears to be an early 19th century structure, originally three bays in length facing east, closely oriented to Falls Road, directly opposite the Kensey Johns Mill. The main portion of this structure is two and one-half storeys in height and measures 20'x35'. A stone chimney rises flush with its south end and the principal entrance was in its northerly bay. Typical windows are 6/6 set in wide frames with backband. Three dormers, containing 3/6 sash, are in the roof.

A one and one-half storey wing extends to the north, two bays in length and measuring 15½'x17'. A stone chimney rises flush with its north gable end.

Stone additions extend the main house one bay to the south, the wing two bays to the north. A one storey, hipped-roof enclosed porch extends in front of the two northerly bays of the main house and the southerly bay of the wing.

The house is built close to the hillside to the west, held away from it by stone retaining walls; portions of the space between the house and the retaining walls have been enclosed as service rooms; a root cellar is west of the kitchen wing, within the bank.

In sequence, the main house with its four walls, appears to have been built first and the kitchen wing added, but the entire process was probably a single construction effort, ca. 1800-1825.

The middle bay of the main house contains two entrances

centered beneath the window above; flanking bays contain a single window in each storey. Many wide window and door frames remain with their cavetto-with-astrigal backbands.

Internally the entire house is largely altered and refinished; the main house is now a single room in the first storey with a modern stone fireplace in its south wall, east of center; an open stair with 20th century detailing rises to the second floor along the west wall. No fireplace is obvious in the kitchen but it may have occupied the easterly portion of the north wall. An enclosed stair rises to the kitchen wing's second floor in the northwest corner. An enclosed winding stairway from the second floor rises to the third in the northeast corner of the main house; it appears original. In the attic are several beaded vertical-board ledge doors and a few rafters are exposed where the original attic joins the attic of the 20th century south wing; they are of straight-sawn oak, numbered and joined at the ridge with pegged mortise-and-tenon. The westerly half of the south gable has been removed but the easterly half remains with its stone chimney. Perhaps there was a pair of south chimneys originally.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

Richard Johns patented Millers Delight, 686 acres, in 1798, Liber IC No. O, f. 460. The stone mill dated at 1806 and also called Kinsey Johns mill, still stands on west bank of Black Rock Run, east side of Falls Road above Butler; now an antique shop associated with Grays Rocky Lodge, surrounded by Gray's Butler Quarry Company. Mr. Clay Stambaugh was operator of the antique shop in 1969 and had restored the mill from ruinous condition.

Henry C. Zouck's name appears here on the 1863 military map, but it was still Johns property until 1873 when deeded (22 acres) to Shadrack Kemp. The estate of Richard Johns was shown in Plat Book JWS No. 1, f. 153 (Towson plats), and comprised Black Rock Mill plus a mill on the north side of present Belfast Road (Shawl's or England's mill). The Black Rock Mill was reached from the west by Old North Mill Road, now Ridge Road, and a now vanished "Old Mill Road" which ran east of Black Rock Run.

Shadrack Kemp sold in 1875 to John Millender and wife, who in 1876 sold to Henry F. Zouck (The atlas shows J.H. Zouck with separate grist and saw mills.) Henry F. Zouck deeded the mill to P.G. Zouck in 1892; Alexander McCurdy acquired the mill in 1903 after default of mortgage and sold to Charles M. Mann, 1905; Mann sold to Thomas F. Gray of Virginia in 1908. Gray installed an electric generator and motors, c. 1910. Mrs. Gray baked samples of bread from Black Rock flour in square pans and Mr. Gray distributed them as far off as Towson. When the flour business declined, he went into quarrying on his own property and in the surrounding area and opened a summer resort and motel, ~~Blackrock~~ History Trails, June 1971, p. 2f.
