LONGNECKER HOUSE (SITE) - 1876 - 1877 - 410 Baltimore Avenue, Towson (SW corner of Baltimore and Pennsylvania Avenues). Well constructed frame house in Italianate style, square tower, built by John H. Longnecker, publisher of the Baltimore County Union. Demolished May, 1970, to make way for the County Courts Building (401 Bosley Avenue).
