
This interesting small house exhibits several interesting architectural details particularly centered around the front gable and the unusual shed roofed dormer construction, which slopes from the gabled roof slopes of the front, projecting wing of the 'L' shaped plan to the roof slope of the wing parallel to Front Avenue.

Probably the purest example of the so-called "stick style" in Lutherville, the gable detail makes extensive use of diagonal "stick" or pseudo half timbering details applied to a typical cottage form.

Other notable detail includes the German siding, the inter-gradation of the small front porch into the structure and the porch column corner brackets.

The front gable contains an unusual awning type attic window centered on the paired windows of the projecting wing with their one over one sash.
