

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **NO**

Formerly the second Lutherville school house, this structure was extensively altered into apartments in 1964 which retained the original form of the school, the projecting entrance pavilion with its porch, and half round round attic vents. As seen in the old photograph accompanying this report, the entrance pavilion's fan lights have been painted out, the double entrance doors have been changed to a single door with side lights, a "window's walk" has been removed from the hipped roof, and all the windows, except those of the pavilion front, have been changed to modern aluminum sliders, replacing original nine over one sash.

Thusly, much of the original Georgian Revival detail has been masked under new work, though the basic profile and proportions still exist. The building has been rather successfully adapted to a new use.



6. LOCATION MAP (Plan Optional)


