
4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **NO**

Another ~~tree~~ bay version of the typical Lutherville cottage form with a central attic gable at right angles to the main roof and set with an attic window forced under the overhang, this house displays ~~backward~~ proportions in the relationship of the two over two sash window openings to the wall surfaces.

Its chief architectural feature of interest may be the detail of extending the one story front porch across the side driveway to form a porte cochere. The drive extends to a garage, stuccoed like the house.

In general the present character of the house suggests that it has been somewhat altered or at least stripped of detail, possibly when stuccoed, probably in the early part of this century.
