

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **NO**

A typical Lutherville three bay cottage, this house with its central attic gable has been somewhat over "restored" with modern doors, red asbestos shingle siding and the addition of a one story wing to the east with its board and batten siding. There seems to have been an attempt to create an "Early American" atmosphere. Two over two sash, louvered blinds, turned porch columns supporting the one story front porch, and the arched attic windows do suggest its original character.

The house is also interesting, though, primarily through the use of an exceedingly small scale and lowness to the grade.
